The Holy Prophet (PBUH) was the first teacher in Islam who with the foundation of human spiritual education, lay it forth. Allah (SWT) choose the uneducated Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) to be the final Messenger and ideal teacher for Muslims. Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), also referred to as the "Living Quran," was tasked with reciting and teaching the Quran to all people. But he wasn't your typical educator. Indeed, he established the

perfect level of education more than a millennium ago, and his influence can still be seen today.⁵ The character and roles of the Holy Prophet (PBUH) as a teacher are as follows:

Prophethood and Revelation

Divine Revelation

It is in the year 610 CE when Holy Prophet (PBUH) first received a revelation from Allah through the Angel Gabriel. This fact was the start of his Prophethood and Islamic time. The disclosures persisted for 23 years and were codified in the Holy Quran.

Role as a Prophet

The Holy Prophet (PBUH) was a prophet, sent by Allah to pass his message unto the men of earth. He was meant to lead them in the right path of righteousness, monotheism and good morals. Holy Prophet (PBUH) always taught his companions how to interpret the Holy Quran and provided them with the knowledge they needed to understand Islam. The newcomer sat in the circle surrounding the Holy Prophet (PBUH) in Dar-e-Argam, Masjid Nabwi, or Suffah. After learning the meanings of the Holy Quran, he would go back and instruct others. When the leaders were occupation residents who spoke harshly and reduced religions to mere superstitions, the Holy Prophet (PBUH) became the Holy Quran's teacher, luring people with his wisdom. He started encouraging good deeds and forbidding bad ones. The Holy Prophet (PBUH) started teaching the Holy Quran at this time, when everyone had started to learn the proper knowledge of the divine. Following the companions' understanding of the Qur'an, the essential realities began to show themselves. As he recited the Holy Quran, the Holy Prophet (PBUH) would explain it. He provides the Ummah with information, teaches them the morals and literature of the Holy Qur'an, solves moral and literary concerns, and eradicates the outer manifestations of inner polytheism, atheism, irregular convictions, arrogance, jealousy, and hatred. The Holy Prophet (PBUH) received his education and instruction in accordance with divine revelation as well. The Holy Prophet addressed a variety of subjects, including monotheism, faith in the Holy Prophets (PBUH), faith in the Hereafter, Khilafat on Earth, brotherhood and equality, justice, unity, freedom, belief, and universal atonement. The Holy Prophet (PBUH) excelled as a teacher and pioneer of reform. Anyone who wishes to observe the education of the Holy Prophet (PBUH) must observe his follows and consider the methods used to raise them. As they adorned the education of the Hereafter, he had an impact on every region of the earth.8

Hadrat Muhammad (PBUH) As the Best Teacher of All Times

As far as related educational materials are concerned, the time of the Holy Prophet (PBUH) was unmatched. He was a top-notch teacher. As said by Muaviyyah ibn Hakam: "May my parents be sacrificed for him. I did not have a teacher better than him before and after him". ⁹ Allah (SWT) says: "He is the One Who raised for the illiterate 'people' a messenger from among themselves reciting to them His revelations, purifying them, and teaching them the Book

and wisdom, for indeed they had previously been clearly astray". The Holy Prophet (PBUH) has explained to his Ummah his obligations as a teacher: "I haven't been sent by Allah (SWT) to rebuke; rather, I've been sent as a teacher to ease people". In order to better the condition of the companions both individually and collectively, the Holy Prophet (PBUH) placed a strong emphasis on education and established the best framework for the educational system. Shortly after, that society attained perfection. 12

The world would be a better place if we could all strive more to lead with tenderness, like Holy Prophet (PBUH) did.
